

Securing the progress of targeted learners

- Additional targeted interventions and support to accelerate SEN pupils and disadvantaged pupils (i.e. catch up, 1:1 tutoring, deployment of SENCO)
Continuation of interventions with proven impact, including reading and mathematics 'catch up' to ensure early intervention for any pupils falling behind in reading, including those pupils who did not pass the phonics test at the end of Year 2

Minimizing the impact of barriers to learning and promoting cultural capital

Continued deployment of learning mentor to support and raise achievement of vulnerable pupils, in particular to support improvements in attendance and to embed recently introduced systems

Investment in additional EWO support, as needed, to ensure attendance strategy is sustained, particularly targeting disadvantaged and vulnerable pupils.

Subsidy of breakfast club for disadvantaged pupils to improve attendance

Subsidy of school journey in year 6 so that all pupils (including disadvantaged pupils) are able to attend

Philosophy for Children. CPD training for whole school:

- to help children become more willing and able to question, reason, construct arguments and collaborate with others
- Support pupils to become more confident with speaking publicly in groups and expressing their ideas, further enhancing pupil voice
- Encourage pupils to be critical, consider multiple perspectives and to think more deeply about a variety of issues and stimuli in such a way that will also support their learning in other subjects.


