<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Sit together, legs stretched in front of you. 2. Stretch out both legs and count the number of toes – ten! 3. Stretch out both legs and hold up some fingers, e.g four fingers. 4. Say this number – ten and four is fourteen. 5. Give each other instructions or show different 'toes-and-finger' numbers. 6. If it is helpful, write some of these numbers! 	<p>Imagine that you lived with a real sabre-tooth tiger / hyena / hare / mammoth / bear. Write the pairs as additions. E.g. 2 visible and 8 hidden $2 + 8 = 10$. 	<p>Split a page in two and write same on one side and different on the other.</p> <p>What is the same and what is different about living in a cave and living in a house?</p>	<p>Can you create your own 'Cave Baby Cave?'</p>
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Take an eggcup and a large mug! 2. Guess how many eggcups of water will fill the mug. 3. Each person writes their guess. 4. Ask as many people as possible! 5. Now fill the mug using the eggcup – count carefully as you go. 6. Whose guess was closest? 7. Bring all your guesses and the correct number into class. 	<p>Make a set of instructions to teach people how to look after a pet scrubbing brush.</p>

Repeat this, measuring how long your partner is in books. 4.
