

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Ask a friend or relative to fish out the coins in their pocket and lay them out on the table – tell them they will get their money back! 2. Write the numbers of each coin. 3. Can you work with a partner to find out how much all the coins add up to? 	<p>Write a fact sheet about gorillas, researching the topic if you need to.</p>	
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Use the following code: Stretch both arms up high standing on tip-toe: Add 10 Crouch down and curl up as small as possible: Add 1 Spread: Hold your arms wide and stand with legs spread: Add 5 2. You start with a score of ten. 3. A partner tells you to 'stretch', 'crouch' or 'spread'. 4. You then do the action and you add the matching amount to your score. 5. Keep doing the actions until you have a score of 100! 	<p>Could you write a similar story to Gorilla, but based on a different animal?</p>	
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Look at a small carton of juice or squash. 2. How many millilitres does it hold? 3. Draw the carton and write how much juice it holds. 4. Talk to a partner – is this more or less than one mug full? 5. Take guesses from family and friends. 6. Tip the juice into an ordinary mug. Who was correct? 	<p>Could you write a thank you letter to Gorilla? What are you thanking him for? What did you learn from Gorilla?</p>	
<p>After you have been shopping, choose 6 different items each costing less than £1. Make a price label for each one e.g. 39p, 78p. Shuffle the labels. Then ask your child to do one or more of these:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Place the labels in order, starting with the lowest. • Say which price is an odd number and which is an even number. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Add 9p to each price in their head. • Take 20p from each price in their head. • Say which coins to use to pay exactly for each item. 	<p>Find a picture of a tunnel, what does it look like? Where does it lead? Could you write an adventure story about it?</p>	
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Look around your home. Can you find a digital clock which counts in minutes? Look on the video or DVD player, or on the cooker. 2. Work with a partner and use this clock to find out how many times you can... <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) Write your initials in one minute? (2) Jump up and down in one minute? (3) Do a head-over-heels roll in two minutes? 3. Can you also time yourselves writing the alphabet? 	<p>You should keep animals in Zoos? Divide a page and put yes on one side and no on the other side. Write as many arguments for and against having animals in zoos</p>	<p>Using every day materials like cardboard boxes, toilet rolls, card, soil, rocks etc, could you design your own Gorilla habitat?</p>
