It should say 5ml on it!</li> <li>Find your favourite mug or cup.</li> <li>Estimate how many medicine spoons it will take to fill your cup.</li> <li>Ask other people in or around your home to estimate – collect and record at least five guesses.</li> <li>Now measure by counting how many 5ml spoonfuls it takes to fill the cup – you can use lentils or dried peas instead of water if you like!</li> </ol>	Could you write a set of instructions on how to deal with a beast? (think about Blodin and the Beast to do this!)	
<ol> <li>Find people in your family or friends to equal 100 years in age.</li> <li>Write names or initials and ages</li> <li>It must be exact!</li> </ol>	Divide a page into two halves and write Yes and No. Is it ok to scare people to make them do what you want them to do?  Write as many 'yes' and 'no' answers on yourt	Can you design your own Viking settlement or longship (or both!)
