

What is the total?</li> <li>Repeat this using someone else's mobile number.</li> <li>Give five different examples.</li> </ol>	<p>Research how the Pyramids were built and write a fact file about them!</p>																																																													
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Write your age.</li> <li>What number must you multiply your age by to get as close as possible to 100?</li> <li>Write the multiplication.</li> <li>Write the age of someone else in your home.</li> <li>What number must you multiply their age by to get as close as possible to 100?</li> <li>Write the multiplication.</li> <li>Repeat this four times.</li> <li>Look at all six multiplications – which person comes out nearest to 100?</li> </ol>	<p>Can you find out 10 facts about the river Nile and 10 facts about the River Thames. Can you explain how they are similar and different to each other?</p>

The Simpsons or Top of the Pops!</li> <li>How many minutes long is it?</li> <li>If you watch it every time it comes on, how long will you spend watching TV each week?</li> <li>How many hours/days would you spend in a year? (Assume the series were to run all year!)</li> <li>How many 8-hour working days is that?</li> </ol>	<p>Could you write a Cinderella story based in another country? In metres?</li> <li>Find at least four people or pets to measure!</li> </ol>	<p>Write an instruction text informing people how to be a good Pharaoh!</p>																																																													
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use six mixed 2p and 1p coins placed in a mug.</li> <li>Tip these out of the mug.</li> <li>Add up the coins that land heads, e.g. 2p + 2p + 1p = 5p.</li> <li>Choose a number from one of the circles below.</li> <li>Divide this by the amount in heads, e.g. 124 ÷ 5 = ...</li> <li>Score the remainder.</li> <li>Let your partner have a turn.</li> <li>Who gets the higher score?</li> <li>Have six goes each.
