<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Measure your stride in centimetres. 2. Then take five strides. 3. Measure the distance you have travelled in metres and centimetres. 4. Double this and divide by ten to find an average stride length. 5. Repeat this process to find the average stride length of other people in your home/community. 6. Who has the longest stride? 7. Who has the shortest? 8. Work out how many strides you have to take to walk a kilometre! 	Can you create a diary entry as a character in the Unforgotten coat and write a diary entry describing how it feels to be chased by a demon?																																		
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Many people don't realise that halving can make a very good way to do a difficult division in your head! 2. Take this one: $1000 \div 8$ 3. Most people will find this hard! 4. But dividing by 8 is the same as halving three times! 5. $1000 \div 2 = 500$. Then $500 \div 2 = 250$. Then $250 \div 2 = 125$. So $1000 \div 8 = 125$. 6. Try the calculations below on your friends and family and then amaze them by working out the answers in your head! <p>$2800 \div 8 = \text{£}10 \div 8 = 144 \div 8 = 512 \div 8 = \text{£}1.20 \div 8 = 7$.</p> <p>Finally carry out a survey. Ask as many people as you can to divide one million by eight!</p>	Divide a page in half and write 'advantages' on one side and 'disadvantages' on the other.
